Historical Context

Stubbs Early Education Center & Dual Generation Center at Stubbs was originally the **Frederick Douglass Stubbs Elementary School**, named after prominent African American Wilmington native and thoracic surgeon Frederick Douglass Stubbs who became a national leader in the care of those suffering from tuberculosis, especially African Americans and residents in low-income communities in Philadelphia. Dr. Stubbs graduated from Howard High School in Wilmington - located directly adjacent to Stubbs EEC.

On February 13, 2018 the Christina Board of Education entered an agreement with the Governor's Office and the Department of Education to implement initiatives to improve outcomes for students in the City of Wilmington. Stubbs Early Education Center was a major outcome of the agreement, and in the 2019-2020 school year, Stubbs EEC welcomed preschool, prekindergarten, and kindergarten scholars from the City of Wilmington residing in the Christina School District feeder.



Data Snapshot

Stubbs Early Education Center currently serves Preschool, Pre-K, Kindergarten, and twenty-one (21) Itinerant students who either reside in, or is enrolled in childcare within the Eastside community of the City of Wilmington. We currently have 225 total students enrolled in our school or receiving direct services.

Signature Programs & Initiatives

Stubbs Early Education Center is a unique by its design. We are an early education center servicing Preschool, Pre-K, and Kindergarten students. Historically, our district's early education center only enrolled Preschool and Pre-K students. Our school is a welcoming community school that provides services for the entire community. Our school is home to the Dual Generation Center at Stubbs which provides focused opportunities for increased educational, personal, and social advancement for children and adults through programs such as the Parents as Teachers Program, Adult Basic Education, WECEC, Department of Labor, \$tand by Me, Delaware Guidance, Children & Families First, Nemours Wellness Center (late November), housing assistance, food pantry, and clothes closet.

Our vision is to become a model school. We pride ourselves in our family and community connections. The culture and climate of Stubbs EEC is one of support and connectedness.
