 - AJe English read statement for Public Comment guidelines


• Public Comment:


- Summer Learning Update:
 - Summer Quest: Shortlidge Elementary:
 - 18 total programs
 - Funding from WLC \$1,472,436.72
 - 1109 students served
 - 239 program staff
 - 58.21 average daily attendance
 - 116.5 hours and 5.1 weeks
 - From 7/2/2025 8/3/2025

 - 4 WLC schools provide an onsite iReady Specialist
 - Students who take iReady assessment are administered 3 times a year
 - 30 % of Students at Shortlidge are at or above grade level in reading
 - Across all Red Clay WLC schools, 54% of students met their typical growth targets and 23% of students met their stretch growth targets in Reading and for math 45% typical growth and 16% stretch growth targets
- Educator Pathways Data:
 - Teacher Assessment Preparation Program (T.A.P.P)
 - > 16 participants from 7 schools
 - Through partnership with Your Teacher Tutor, certified teachers trained as tutors led weekly classes
 - Designed to reduce barriers to teacher certification, offering structured tutoring, targeted resources and a supportive learning community
 - ➤ 63% of participants either passed or met qualifying passing scores for multiple measures
 - Many saw major increase from previous exams pre-to-post Spring prep course





- Teacher Leadership Design Fellowship (TLDF)
 - > Total of 33 participating educators across 11 schools
 - > 79% program retention rate 26 of 33 fellows continuing on to year 2 of program
 - ➤ 29 of 33 remaining at current school or promoted to leadership role
 - > TNTP is partnering with 4,052 school districts and 33,847 schools across 32 states
- What We Do:

- Four identified Principals and APs will participate in bi-monthly, full day Professional Learning and Building a Shared Vision for High-Quality Instruction
- All Principals and APS will have two 1-hour coaching sessions per month, one in person and one virtual
