











Data Snapshot: SY 25 EOY iReady Math

Math i-Ready Diagnostic (End of Year) Grades 1-8








Data Snapshot: SY 25 EOY iReady Reading Stretch Growth and Typical Growth




Reading- Stretch Growth '25








Data Snapshot: SY 25 EOY iReady Math Stretch Growth and Typical Growth

EOY Student Outcome Goals

To improve student proficiency rates from 8%-18% on the SBAC in English Language Arts, The Bayard School will ensure full implementation of district-approved high-quality instructional materials, including i-Ready Growth for Grades 1–2, Benchmark Advance for Grades 3–5, and ARC for Grades 6–8.

To improve student proficiency rate from 5%-15% on the SBAC in Math. The Bayard School will ensure full implementation of district i-Ready growth, supported by structured professional learning communities and progress monitoring cycles. Teachers will engage in regular data analysis to inform small group instruction, target foundational math gaps, and provide differentiated interventions through MTSS.

Signature Programs & Initiatives

High-Quality Instruction: Full implementation of HQIM (i-Ready, Benchmark Advance, ARC) to ensure rigorous, standards-aligned learning.

Social-Emotional and Enrichment Programs: SEL integration, restorative practices, and wellness initiatives to support student growth and engagement, Unleashed a Wellness Wednesday Retreat, Pedal Pack and Pack Training.

Community Partnerships: Collaboration with the Boys & Girls Club, United Way, CTE programs; Family Community Council, Children & Families First, The Juice Joint, WLC, iReady, and local organizations to provide enrichment, resources, and wraparound support.

- Building Wraps & Branding Fund visual upgrades (murals, hallway wraps, banners) that instill school pride and a college-and-career-ready culture.
